Q1 Current Vermont law provides for a jail term of up to six months and a fine of up to \$500 for simple possession of marijuana. Would you support or oppose a change in the law to provide for a fine of up to \$150 without jail time for those who possess an ounce or less of marijuana for personal use?

Q2 Would you be more or less likely to vote for your state legislator if he or she voted to replace the current criminal penalties for possession of an ounce of marijuana with a fine of up to \$150, or would it not make a difference to you?

Q3 Under current Vermont state law, it is legal for people who have cancer, AIDS, and other serious illnesses to use and grow marijuana for medical purposes, as long as their physicians approve.
