

Oklahoma SQ820 Ballot Measure Summary

State Question 820 is a statutory citizen-initiated measure that will appear on Oklahomans' ballot. Read the full text of the measure here.

What the measure does

- Permits adults 21 years of age or older to possess and purchase up to:
 - One ounce of cannabis flower;
 - Eight grams of cannabis concentrate; and
 - Eight grams of cannabis in the form of infused cannabis products;
- Allows adults to cultivate up to six mature cannabis plants (with no more than 12 mature cannabis plants per residence);
- Directs the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority (OMMA) to regulate and oversee the adultuse cannabis market similarly to the regulation of medical cannabis, including the licensing of manufacturers and dispensaries;
- Stipulates that only existing medical cannabis businesses may be issued adult-use licenses in the first two years after the effective date of the initiative;
- Requires the department to promulgate regulations for the testing, packaging, and labeling of cannabis products to ensure product safety;
- Establishes a 15% excise tax on cannabis sales (in addition to normal state and local sales taxes); proceeds from this tax are directed to support public schools, drug treatment services, local governments, and the state's general fund; and
- Enable a process for individuals to file petitions with Oklahoma courts to have criminal records for low-level marijuana offenses expunged.

What the measure does not do

- Permit the use of cannabis any place where the use of tobacco is prohibited; or
- Require employers to change their workplace drug use policies.
