## Methodology

- Data presented here are the summary of surveying 350 Known Republican Primary Registered Voters in South Carolina. Field dates were April 8-11, 2022.
- Respondents were contacted by telephone using a combination of valid residential and cellular telephone listings. 210 respondents were reached via landline; 140 respondents were reached via cell phone.
- Each respondent is registered to vote in South Carolina and is part of a representative sample based on current voter registration statistics. Data was stratified to represent accurate proportions in vital characteristics including race, age, gender, geography and political persuasion.
- The margin of error for a survey of this type is $\pm 4.9 \%$ in 19 out of 20 cases.
