Packaging and Labeling Medical Cannabis

Medical cannabis, like any medication, should be properly packaged and labeled. In most cases, the regulatory authority responsible for oversight creates the guidelines for packaging and labeling of medical cannabis products.

Package should include information such as the percentage of THC and CBD. It should also contain warnings such as “keep out of reach of children.” Packaging should be childproof but still easily accessible to the elderly and people with disabilities.

Sample language:

(xx) Not later than 120 days after the effective date of this chapter the department shall promulgate regulations:

- (1) creating requirements and procedures for the safe and accurate packaging and labeling of medical cannabis; and
- (2) establishing labeling requirements for cannabis and cannabis products, including requiring cannabis products’ labels to include the following:
 - (A) the length of time it typically takes for a product to take effect;
 - (B) disclosing ingredients and possible allergens; and
 - (C) a nutritional fact panel.
